

Gritting

Waste Management staff gritted areas of high priority around schools, bus stops, cycle-ways, shop fronts, churches and Garda Stations to keep pedestrians & cyclists safe during the cold spell in December. The Road Maintenance Department focused on main thoroughfares.

Planters

New sustainable 100% recycled plastic planters were delivered to Main Street Clongriffin, The Clans in Donnycarney & Apollo Way in Coolock just in time for Christmas.

The square style containers were planted up with silver birch trees as a centre piece and around the tree are a selection of the following plants:

- Viburnum tinusm- an evergreen pollinator friendly shrub that starts flowering in late autumn and flowers until late spring so is great for winter interest and food for bees when there is very little else Hellebores in pinks and whites
- Geranium dreamland
- Purple Heucheras
- Pink polyanthus

The tiered style planter was planted up with the following variety of plants:

- Geranium dreamland
- Salvia caradonna
- Geranium rozanne
- Hellebore
- · Pink polyanthus



Huge thanks to Joe O'Reilly and his team in Parks for planting up the containers for us and getting them safely onsite on Thursday 22nd December 2022.





The planters in The Clans & Apollo Way are being trialled and if they are successful we will consider placing more of these planters with trees in these areas in 2023. Residents had expressed a wish for more trees in their locality and since the pathways are not suitable for planting into we are trialling this idea.

We have also been renovating and moving some wooden planter boxes from areas where they are not being cared for. Here are some images of the planters at their new homes in the North Central.

Leaf Composting


We received a request for help to clear an area close to the Post Office on Griffith Avenue that had extensive leaf fall and no residents living nearby to clear it. The Parks team from Albert College Park helped us to remove the old leaf baskets from the site and they will use the compost in the park. We then organised for the area to be cleared and we placed some new leaf composting baskets with signage at the location. Huge thanks to the Drainage Team for providing us with much needed water on the day to wet the leaves before we placed them into the baskets and for giving us a helping hand to fill the baskets.
