### 1. Local Area Plan Update

#### Site 6 – Coultry, Main Street

The Housing Department are discussing the development of the site under the CREL Cost Rental model with O'Cualann. Further update to issue by end Q1, 2023.

#### Site 19 - St. Joseph's

A Further Information Request (FIR) was issued for Planning Application 4855/22. The main elements contained in this relate to drainage and roads. The Drainage Department issued a report on actions required at a meeting held in December which O'Cualann's Architects are currently assessing. Once these issues have been addressed a similar meeting will be arranged with the Roads Department to ascertain what actions are required. Other issues in the Further Information Request are being addressed.

### Site 21 (Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre)

Dublin City Council Housing and Community Services secured the maximum grant of €100,000 per unit under the Affordable Housing Fund in December. O'Cualann are due to submit new development proposals for the 12 properties on this site to the Housing Section.

#### Site 25 – Parkview

Planning Application 5252/22 was lodged on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2022. The final date for submitting observations was 22<sup>nd</sup> December and a decision is due in relation to the application. This application is for 34 dwellings and a crèche. Planning permission 3069/22 was granted for 36 older person's units in 2022 for this site.

### Sites requiring Expressions of Interest

#### Sites 8 (West of Coultry Park) and 9 (Coultry Park)

Expression of Interest documentation is being finalised. The Area office and LAP team are to be consulted. The Expression of Interest will be for mixed tenure development with consideration for sheltered housing.

#### Site 11 - Sillogue Avenue and Site 13 - Sillogue Road

Expression of Interest documentation have been finalised following surveying and consultation with the Area Office and LAP team. Expression of Interest will issue to the AHB Sector in the coming week for mixed tenure development with consideration for sheltered housing.

#### **Dublin City Council Affordable Schemes**

#### Site 12 - Sillogue Road and Site 14 - Balbutcher Lane

Density requirements for both sites are being finalised in advance of a Part VIII Application. A further update will issue to members of the NWAC in the coming weeks. Dublin City Council are due to meet with the Ballymun City Farm Committee in January in relation to the City Farm proposal for site 14.

### Sillogue Infrastructure Scheme

Works are continuing on the installation of utilities within Sillogue Gardens. Currently work on the paving at the western end of Sillogue Gardens with the area around houses 96 to 112 almost complete. The paving works will then move onto the laneway adjacent to Our Lady's

Nursery. Kerbing and pavement installation has also commenced in the area between houses 28 to 39.

## 2. Community and Social Development

#### General Community Development

The Community and Social Development Section (CSDS) are currently reviewing work completed in 2022 and are working on a calendar and plans for work in 2023. To date, the team have had meetings with Axis Ballymun, Rediscovery Centre and BADIG in relation to collaborative ideas for 2023.

The Community and Social Development general and adult education grants for 2022 are currently being received by Community groups.

#### Social Inclusion initiatives

### Older Persons Council

A second meeting of the new North West Area Older Persons Council took place in Finglas on Tuesday the 9<sup>th</sup> December. There were additional members present at this meeting however additional members are being sought from both Ballymun and Finglas.

Potential projects discussed for 2023 included the rolling out of an Age Friendly Town campaign and an Age Friendly Business campaign, as well as a campaign to ensure information on age friendly activities are available to all older residents, especially the most isolated of this cohort. It is intended that the group will take on a very real and active role in their communities.



#### Youth Related Initiatives

#### Youth Led Creative Arts/Recycling Project

Fantastic Christmas trees made completely from recyclable materials were produced as part of a joint educational and creative project between Dublin City Council Community and Social Development team, Aisling Project Poppintree, Youthreach, Poppintree Youth Project and local artist Stuart Dowie. These colourful trees were displayed in the local centres and

are sustainable and can be used in future years. Funding for this project was sourced through Creative Ireland.



#### Better Ballymun

The Community and Social Development and the Public Domain teams had an initial ideas meeting in Trinity Comprehensive in relation to the successful youth-led environmental Better Ballymun Initiative which is now in its third year and is due to take place in early March. The aim this year is to include some innovative community projects that will be sustainable and which can develop into longer-term projects.

#### 3. Economic Development Update



Ballymun 4 business - 'Jingle Mingle'

In December Ballymun 4 business hosted its Christmas Networking event in Musgrave Market Place. Key-note speaker on the evening was motivational coach Gerry Duffy who delivered an inspirational talk on setting and achieving goals for 2023.

We also bid farewell to Catherine

Whelan who departed her role as facilitator after 6 years in the role. The event capped a good year for Ballymun that saw the return to hosting in-person events from March that included; Reboot Your Networking skills in Ballymun Civic Centre, the Grill & Chill summer meet-up in Aspen and the Climate Action event in the Rediscovery Centre. In all over 150 people attended the events. B4b continued to support local initiatives such as Ballymun
