4. SPC Strategic Priorities 2023

Cllr Alison Gilliland indicated that a strategic workplan for the committee was to be developed and suggested several strategic issues and provided an opportunity for members to discuss and provide additional suggestions. The following topics were suggested

- Delivery Unactivated planning permissions, engagement with private developers. Use of vacant properties above commercial businesses, establishing a register of vacant properties, rapid builds
- Regeneration Possibility of speeding up process with deep retrofit rather than demolish and rebuild particularly given digital twin technology to allow for better embedded and operational carbon decision making.
- Green builds

- Accommodating diversity promoting a more extensive lifecycle planning approach, one and a half bedroom units to accommodate carers
- Homeless day services/street food.
- Availability of Emergency Accommodation & Exist Strategies from this accommodation.

It was agreed that off site visits & workshops for members of the Committee would substitute some monthly meetings.

It was agreed that Construction Cost Analysis Report issued to members in January 2023 would be represented and discussed at the March meeting.

In particular, we recognise the potential for our approach when preparing voids and acquisitions for allocation to transition towards a circular economy approach - one that maximises the re-use and re-cycling of internal materials. The Housing SPC therefore requests that a pathway towards this approach be explored, including a consideration of the benefit of joining the European Investment Bank supported Circular City Centre (C3) support programme (<u>https://advisory.eib.org/about/circular-city-centre.htm</u>) and a report presented back to the Housing SPC within 6 months.
