PUBLIC DOMAIN TEAM UPDATE FOR THE MARCH MEETING OF THE NORTH CENTRAL AREA COMMITTEE

Special Clean Ups

The pedestrian walkway adjacent to Buttercup Avenue/Marigold Avenue, Darndale was cleaned and power washed by the Waste Management Team on 10th February followed by a further clean-up of the Spine site after the installation of a new gate to facilitate vehicular access.













Illegal Dumping

The Grange Park Crescent side of Kilbarrack DART Station was also cleaned up in conjunction with the Parks Department, who cleaned the green space & Waste Management who removed the illegal dumping, litter picked the footbridge, removed the burned out vehicles from St. Berach's Place and then cleaned and power hosed the area to remove all of the debris and scorch marks.













Shop Fronts

Public footpaths adjoining shop fronts right across the North Central Area are regularly power washed by the 6am crew to ensure they are clean and presentable for the businesses.



Graffiti
Graffiti continues to be removed right across the North Central Area. The Clontarf shelters were badly hit by racisit graffifi and this is in the process of being removed.

Community Clean Ups & Equipment

We will be working closely with the NCA Community Teams to support and help groups who are not familiar with the application process.

Note: Applicants need to submit 4 photographs with their application and a sketch map of the location they are putting forward. We suggest that they print off 4 of their best before & after photos which give a general impression of the area and any improvements made. Photos should have name, address and contact details for the entrant on the back. There is also an opportunity for applicants to submit details of any future plans or projects on a separate sheet which they could be working on now in advance of the application being released.
