#### 1. Local Area Plan Update

### Site 6 - Coultry Road / Main Street

DCC Housing are discussing the development of the site under the CREL Cost Rental model with O'Cualann.

### Site 19 - St. Joseph's

The applicant is currently finalising all issues raised in the Further Information (FI) request dated 8<sup>th</sup> November 2022 relating to Planning Application 4853/22. This followed a number of meetings with Dublin City Council works Departments on the requirements by the FI Request. A formal submission to the FI will be made shortly.

# Site 21 - Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre

O'Cualann are due to provide Housing and Community Services with a project plan for the delivery of this scheme. The maximum Affordable Housing Fund grant of €100,000 per unit which was awarded in December 2022 has increased the scheme's viability for 12 properties at this location.

#### Site 25 - Parkview

Planning Application 5252/22 was lodged on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2022. This application is for 34 dwellings and a crèche. A Further Information (FI) request was issued by Planning on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2023. The FI response is currently being developed by O'Cualann and has been assisted by several meetings with Dublin City Council works Departments. It is anticipated that this will be formally submitted in the coming weeks.

# **Sites requiring Expression of Interest**

### Sites 11 and 13 - Sillogue Avenue and Sillogue Road/Holy Spirit

Expression of Interest documentation was issued by DCC Housing Department on 20<sup>th</sup> January for development proposals for both sites. The closing date for submissions is 28<sup>th</sup> March 2023.

#### Sites 8 and 9 - NW of Coultry Park and Coultry Road

These sites are currently being prepared for Expression of Interest for the development of the site. Housing and Community Services has met with the Area Office and internal Departments to agree on infrastructural requirements. These are currently being finalised and the Expression of Interest will then issue to the AHB sector.

#### **DCC Affordable Schemes**

#### Sites 12 and 14 - Sillogue Road and Balbutcher Lane

Density requirements for both sites are being finalised in advance of Part VIII Application. A meeting took place on 17<sup>th</sup> February attended by DCC Officials, NWA Elected Members and the City Farm Committee to discuss the City Farm proposal on site 14. Correspondence has issued to the City Farm and regular updates will be provided to members.

### North City Operations Depot

The construction of the North City Operations Depot continues to progress well and is now entering the final stages of construction.

Works are continuing at roof level of the Administration & Welfare Building to complete roof top plant as well as final works to the roof light-wells. Water tightness tests to be carried out in advance of the installation of roof paving and sedum blanket. Externally works continue to progress well with the installation of the timber and coloured fins and Bris Soleil

ongoing. Internal works are continuing including fitting of sanitary ware, showers, tiles, lights, ceiling grids and acoustic panels.

Application of floor coatings is continuing in the Multi Storey Car Park (MSCP) and is weather dependant. Timber fins bracketing works have not yet commenced (brackets have now arrived on site). Works to complete the vertical planting on the building is nearing completion. 2nd fix Mechanical & Electrical installations are continuing in the Workshops. Completions to the Workshop door reveals have commenced. Installation of racking in the Central Stores is complete. Work on the Salt Barn's timber wall cladding is almost complete with cladding details to the bottoms of the diagonal bracing to be finalised. Electrical works are due to commence shortly.

The Civic Amenity Site (CAS) Office roof works are continuing with sedum covering installation.

The permanent east side access is in use by the Contractor as the main construction access. The Contractor moved some of their site compound to the CAS area and they are continuing to use the CAS access for staff vehicles. Footpath works external to the CAS boundary wall are substantially complete and landscaping works have commenced. There will be work done to cut out some of the new footpath to provide additional landscaping.

There have been some delays to the project programme and, assuming no further delays, the scheduled completion of construction is late April 2023. There will be a fit-out period after that for furniture and IS configuration. It is anticipated that the depot will be operations-ready in May 2023.

DCC Traffic Section Works: As part of the pre-planning permission discussions about the NCOD with Fingal County Council it was agreed that the traffic signal control of three junctions immediately in the vicinity of the NCOD would be brought into DCC's traffic control system. Road works at all three junctions will be required to enable this. The three junctions are: (1) the junction at the eastern access to the NCOD, (2) the junction at Ikea/Decathlon entrance and (3) the junction at St. Margaret's Road / Carton Way. Dublin City Council Traffic Section is planning on commencing work on 3 junctions on St. Margaret's Road possibly from the end of week commencing 7th March. DCC Traffic's contractor, Citius, will be carrying out these works.

#### Sillogue Infrastructure

Works are continuing within Sillogue Gardens with the extra paving contractors now on site. The new public lighting infrastructure is being installed at the same time as the new paving. Landscaping works were due to commence on 9th March with new trees being planted over the coming weeks. The Area Office Community and Public Domain Teams are currently engaging with the residents and Our Nursery to seek their involvement in this process and future environmental projects to benefit the area.

Unfortunately there is a lot of illegal parking on the new footpaths around the crèche there is ongoing engagement with the Board of Management & Crèche Manger to seek assistance in resolving this matter.

Discussions are on-going to resolve the footpath connection issue between the rear of Sillogue Gardens and Wad River Close. A proposal for a new ramp has been developed and the area office and housing division will engage with the local residents to agree these works.

#### 2. Community and Social Development

#### **Social Inclusion initiatives**

### Older Persons Council

The Community and Social Development Section (CSDS) are continuing to work with the new Older Persons Council (OPC) and organised a number of trips to local community facilities with members as part of a scoping exercise to ascertain recreational, educational and wellbeing activities currently available for older persons in Ballymun and Finglas. Interested members are still being sought for the OPC.

#### Balcurris Park Enhancement

The CSDS along with the Reflection Garden Committee and Slaintecare Local Development Officer have carried out a survey with residents surrounding Balcurris Park in relation to the pending upgrade works. These proposed works will include: an outdoor gym, enhanced play areas/paths and the installation of a reflection garden to commemorate residents who have passed away. They also gathered additional suggestions around further possible enhancements to increase the user-friendliness of this natural amenity. Overall residents were strongly in favour of the enhancement of the Park but also cited reasons for the current lack of usage which centred on safety and security issues.

### **Autism-Related Services**

A number of meeting have taken place regarding the increased need for autism related services in the local area. The team have decided that an important first step is to undertake a scoping exercise of community organisations that currently provide some level of service in this regard.

#### International Women's Day

The CSDS organised an event in collaboration with the Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre to celebrate inspirational local women on Thursday the 9<sup>th</sup> March .The success of the Poppintree Community Weekly Walking Group was celebrated in particular through displayed photos, chat, fun and sing songs. There were over fifty women at the event many of whom are members of the walking group.

#### Youth Related Initiatives

# Summer Projects

The Community Tam are currently advertising for volunteers interested in becoming involved with a new local summer project. The FACT summer project is also being supported to set back up again this year. A number of meetings have taken place in this regard with Crosscare.

# Better Ballymun

Following significant collaboration and support from Trinity Comprehensive, the Community and Social Development team, the Public Domain team, Parks Department and many other agencies organisations, residents and Volunteers, this positive youth-led environmental initiative rolled out a very successful programme on the 3<sup>rd</sup> March.

The projects chosen by students this year included: planting projects in Crannogue Close, Ard Na Meala, Trinity Comprehensive, Marewood Crescent and Setanta; painting projects at Shangan Park, Poppintree Neighbourhood Centre; a tree count in the area, a survey at Balcurris Park; dog fouling initiatives and a litter pick at St Joseph's Hill. Dublin City Council provided a financial contribution, plants materials and clean up equipment for the day, Dublin City Council teams and the Lord Mayor Caroline Conroy were involved in individual projects on the day.







#### Additional Youth Related

The team have had a number of meetings with the Ballymun Scouts group and have committed to providing additional support to this group throughout 2023.

#### **Other Initiatives**

#### Fairtrade Fortnight

The Ballymun Fairtrade Working group organised a number of small community initiatives during Fairtrade Fortnight 2023 (February 27<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> March) to highlight and publicise the Fairtrade Campaign. This year, the awareness campaign is centred on the effect of climate change on the long-term production of items such as coffee and chocolate and is advocating for actions that individuals can take which may in time reverse climate change and support the sustainability of the cocoa crop.
