Litter Hotline/CRM/Citizens Hub

In the period 1st – 28th April 2023, incidents were reported via Litter Hotline/CRM/Citizens HUB for the Central Area.

In addition to the CRM & Citizens Hub incidents, the Public Domain crew carry out inspections of their assigned routes on a daily basis. They collect any dumped bags/materials found, that is not always reflected on the above figures.

The total tonnage of collected illegally dumped items from our four vehicles was:

- **33.2 tonne** for April 2023. Last month's total was 37.38, not 33.38 tonne as previously reported. Bringing the total for this year to 139.61 tonne.

Community Clean-ups

Community Clean-up equipment was distributed to **12** Community Groups / individuals between 1st April – 31st April. Requests for the removal of bags from community clean ups were handled by Waste Management and Public Domain staff.

Graffiti Removal

There were 14 requests to remove graffiti during the month of March. Internal staff as well as private contractor PMAC carried out all removals.
