


## Santry River Restoration and Greenway Project

- Other societal needs, including active travel










# Other challenges and issues

- Approximately 4.5 km of culverts
- 2 flood defence structures (Santry pond & Harmonstown Road)
- 60 inflows, incl.
  - CSOs
  - Pumping Station Overflow
- Approx. 20 bridges
  - 2 motorways/duel-carriageways
  - 12 roads
  - 1 railway line
  - Pedestrian bridges
- Fragmented/disjointed cycle infrastructure
- 18 schools v 4 playgrounds
- Lots of sports facilities v no other recreation or amenity facilities




## Archaeology and Heritage


