Not Recommended	The area engineer does not recommend a no right turn on Glasilawn Road into Ballygall Road East. During a site visit, the traffic was observed to be running well, with no long waiting periods on Glasilawn Road. A recent installed Yellow Box at the junction with Ballygall Rd East was observed to be working well allowing drivers from Glasilawn Road to turn right. It is also difficult for Gardaí to enforce traffic restrictions that apply only for short periods of time. Vehicles looking to turn left to the schools can use an alternative route through Fitzmaraurice Road, as well as vehicles looking to turn right can use Griffith Avenue. Recommended	In order to make the junction of Casement Road/North Road (west of roundabout) safer, the area engineer recommends the replacement of the Yield Sign and associated Yield Lines, for a Stop Sign accompanied by a Stop Line supplemented by a worded STOP Marking. 3	11145336	Double Yellow Lines	GLASANAON ROAD (NW)	Dublin 11	Double yellow lines requested outside 162 Glasanaon Road.	Not Recommended	The Area Engineer does not recommend double yellow lines outside property No. 162 Glasanaon Road. It is not the policy of Dublin City Council to provide double yellow lines in front of driveways. There is not enough space for a vehicle to be parked legally at this place. Under the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations, Section 36, paragraph (2), "a vehicle shall not be parked... (g) in any place, position or manner that will result in the vehicle obstructing an entrance or an exit for vehicles to or from a premises, save with the consent of the occupier of such premises; (i) on a footway, a grass margin or a median strip; (k) in a manner in which it will interfere with the normal flow of traffic or which obstructs or endangers other traffic Please note that instances of illegal parking should be reported to Dublin Street Parking Services, the City Council's parking enforcement contractor (Ph: 01-602 2500 or Email parkingenforcement@dublincity.ie), or to the local Gardaí, as it is a matter for enforcement under the Road Traffic Regulations. Not Recommended	<p>The area engineer does not recommend double yellow lines on Beneavin Park. The road is wide enough to accommodate parking on one side. On street parking acts as traffic calming by reducing the available carriageway and raising driver's attention.</p> <p>It is not the policy of Dublin City Council to provide parking restrictions where restrictions are already covered under the law, as this would lead to a proliferation of same.</p> <p>Under the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations, Section 36, paragraph (2), "a vehicle shall not be parked... Not Recommended	<p>The Area Engineer does not recommend double yellow lines on Saint Pappin Road at the junction with Dean Swift Road. Currently it's not policy of Dublin City Council to provide parking restrictions where it's already covered under the law.</p> <p>Under The Road Traffic (Traffic & Parking) Regulations, Section 36 paragraph "(2) A vehicle shall not be parked - (c) within 5 metres of a road junction;</p> <p>(k) in a manner in which it will interfere with the normal flow of traffic or which obstructs or endangers other traffic;</p> <p>Please note that instances of illegal parking should be reported to Dublin Street Parking Services, the City Council's parking enforcement contractor (Ph: 01-602 2500 or Email parkingenforcement@dublincity.ie), or to the local Gardaí, as it is a matter for enforcement under the Road Traffic Regulations.</p>	Member of the Public	16/10/2023	1
6	11146411	Children Crossing Sign	CLANCY AVENUE (NW)	Dublin 11	request signage.	Not Recommended	<p>The area engineer does not recommend a children at play signage on Clancy Road. Dublin City Council does not provide children at play signage.</p> <p>Clancy Road is located within the 30km/h speed zone and the area is a Home Zone/Slow Zone, which warns motorists that it is a residential area and to expect children. This sign has been installed at the junction with Sycamore Rd and on Clancy Avenue at the junction with Jamestown Road, where a 30 km/h speed limit is being implemented and a 'Slow Zone' is being created in the city.</p> <p>The road has a 30km/h roundel to alert drivers. It is Dublin City Councils policy not to erect repeater signs as this will lead to a proliferation of signage throughout the city.</p>	TD	28/10/2023	0
