Q.1 Question in the name of Councillor John Lyons

“To ask the Manager to ensure the replacement of the back door of **(details supplied)** and any other repairs deemed necessary after a maintenance inspection is conducted.”

Q.2 Question in the name of Councillor Mícheál Mac Donncha

“To ask the Manager what is the intention with the works commenced on Foxfield Green Park where concrete bases, apparently for benches, were installed, but not completed, with plastic cones left. Will benches be installed and when will this work be completed?”

Q.3 Question in the name of Councillor Alison Field

“To ask the Manager to trim/prune the trees in All Saints Park and the Rectory Park on Wades Avenue, St. Anne’s Raheny.”

Q.4 Question in the name of Councillor Alison Field

“To ask the Manager to place two double yellow lines just pillar size outside **(details supplied)**. The lady's son is in a wheelchair and she has major issue's driving in and out of her drive in with people parking to the brim of the pillars of her home. So she can't get in and out at times. Her vehicle is large to allow for wheelchair use for her son. The cars outside seem to be dart users parking there. She is looking for yellow lines to be put outside both pillars, just the width of the pillars so she can get in and out of her driveway. I would be grateful if this could be treated as an emergency, to make her life a little easier.”

Q.5 Question in the name of Councillor Alison Field

“To ask the Manager to do some work at the Bull Wall. The steps in the ladies shelter need an upgrade, the plastic covers are dangerous and need hosing down every evening. At the mixed shelter all rails at steps to access the water are unsafe as very wobbly. Steps are covered in seaweed which is understandable so better if rails were made stable. If beach entry for cars beyond happy out was monitored and potholes filled, it would alleviate parking in the area and reduce congestion. (The resident understands that in winter this area gets waterlogged and action is only possible once the sand dries up)”.

Q.6 Question in the name of Councillor Alison Field

“To ask the Manager to trim the trees on Watermill Drive, St. Anne’s. The resident explained to me that gangs are leaving bags of drink/drugs under the trees where they are being dropped off and picked up. The resident has also reported it to the Gardaí. If the trees were trimmed up and pruned to even height level, it would stop this hiding area, as there is a school near this area.”

“To ask the Manager to provide a loading bay area for delivery trucks outside the shops at **(details supplied)** as delivery trucks are regularly parked all over the place and it can be dangerous. The resident also would like some planter tubs to be placed around the shops.”

“To ask the Manager to survey outside **(details supplied)**, as the resident lives on the curve and with cars parked and cars turning it is very dangerous”.

“To ask the Manager to fix a hole in the middle of the road on **(details supplied)**. I think the resident was on before but can’t find the reference number”.

“To ask the Manager to survey for speed ramps on Dunluce Road as requested by the resident living in **(details supplied)** who has complained about the speeding issues”.

“To ask the Manager to survey the speed issue on Celtic Park Road off Collins Avenue as trucks and cars drive at speed down this road.”

“To ask the Manager to look into a previous request from a resident at the Junction of Castle Avenue and Howth Road. The reference number is **(details supplied)**”.

“To ask the manager to provide a detailed breakdown of the construction cost of each unit being built by Glenveagh on the public lands at the Oscar Traynor Road site; to provide a detailed analysis of the construction costs versus the affordable purchase price being charged for the 20% of new homes on the site; to provide a detailed analysis of the construction costs versus the cost to Dublin City Council in acquiring the new social homes; to provide a detailed analysis of the construction costs versus the proposed cost rental rents; and details on the original contract between Dublin City Council and Glenveagh and any changes to the agreed pricing structures and costs.”

“To ask the manager to install a series of appropriate road signs in Kilmore West, particularly on the roads around Scoil Ide and Scoil Fhursa, informing every one of the speed limit and the presence of children at play in the area.”

“To ask the manager to review the traffic flows along Castlekevin Road, Kilmore West, with a view to taking measures to address the dangers faced by residents on the road by motorists using it as a rat run.”

“To ask the manager to arrange an inspection of **(details supplied)** with a view to building an extension for the family. The home, at present, is too small for the family but they do have a large back garden.”

“To ask the manager to treat as a matter of urgency the removal of waste from the back garden at **(details supplied)**. This matter has been raised before on numerous occasions yet no action has been taken. ”

“To ask the manager to review the request of **(details supplied)** for ancillary family accommodation for her 76 year old mother.”

“To ask the manager to install speed ramps along Glenshesk Road and repair the footpath outside **(details supplied)**.”

“To ask the manager to repair the kerb at **(details supplied)**”

Q.21 Question in the name of Councillor Paddy Monahan

“To ask the manager to install bollards on both sides of the Howth Road to create physical segregation of the cycle lane from Greendale Road to Main Street, Raheny.”

“To ask the manager to take such steps as are necessary to deal with a tree and root-damaged footpath at **(details supplied)**, where the visually impaired resident is badly affected by both the damaged footpath and blocked light.”

“To ask the manager to investigate and rectify mould and water supply issues at **(details supplied)**”

“To ask the manager to install dished kerbs where Cedar Walk, Raheny, meets Foxfield Road, Foxfield Avenue and Foxfield Grove. There are currently no dished kerbs at any of these junctions and this causes difficulties for people with disabilities, people with mobility issues, older people and people with buggies and prams.”

“To ask the manager to install speed ramps and/or other traffic calming measures on Foxfield Road, particularly around the green space that is used by children.”

“To ask the manager what is the purpose of the minor works at the green area between Foxfield Park and Foxfield Grove. Work began some months ago and stalled very quickly. If seats are to be installed when will this happen?”

“To ask the manager when the area around Belmayne Park will be formally taken in charge by Dublin City Council so that the playground that has been derelict for years can be reinstated.”

Q.28 Question in the name of Councillor Paddy Monahan

“To ask the manager when Belmayne Avenue and Belmayne Boulevard will be taken in charge by Dublin City Council.”

Q.29 Question in the name of Councillor Paddy Monahan

“To ask the manager to investigate the ongoing neglect of the section of the Malahide Road from the junction at Churchwell Gardens south to the crossroads at the R139, which is badly overgrown and to rectify this as soon as possible?”

“To ask the manager to give an update on improvement plans for Edenmore Park, including the provision of bins, dog waste bins and improvements to paths.”

“To ask the manager for a status update on the lease for St Luke’s Youth Club, Kilmore West.”

Work has been ongoing in the building for the past few months and seems to have been completed. This building has been used by a number of groups in the community over the past number of years and is an asset to the community which should not be let go to waste.”

“To ask the manager to fill a hole on the footpath at **(details supplied)**. The hole was caused by a fallen tree and is now a trip hazard for elderly residents.”

“To ask the manager for an update on consultation with the residents of Cromcastle Court on the expected refurbishment of the flat complex.”

“To ask the manager for an update on the consultation with residents in respect to the Glenveigh Community Fund and what this fund will be spent on?”

“To ask the manager to set a date for the next Kilmore West Community Safety Forum. The residents would like a set date each month as is the case in other communities throughout the area.”

“To ask the manager for an update on the promised Traffic Forum for the area. The residents of Kilmore West, Riverside and Clonshaugh in particular have a serious issue with parking and traffic enforcement in the area. The area is used as a rat run to and from the M1/M50, a car park for Beaumont Hospital and a strategy to support the residents in the area must be implemented. A Traffic Forum would give residents an opportunity to share their ideas, thoughts and possible solutions to the traffic chaos in the area.”

“To ask the manager for an update on the refurbishment of a property at **(details supplied)**. The property was purchased by Dublin City Council with the tenant in situ and has had no work done to the property to bring it up to fire and safety regulations.”

“To ask the manager to install speed ramps on Kilmore Drive. Local residents are already putting together a petition to have these installed. Kilmore Drive is the only street in the estate which does not have speed ramps and as such is used by speeding drivers who try to avoid the ramps elsewhere. The street has a very high number of children on the street on a daily basis as St John Vianney Football Club is located here. Any measures which would assist the children and other pedestrians in the area accessing Kilmore Drive would be very much appreciated by the residents.”

“To ask the manager for an upgrade to the dressing room facilities in Albert College Park. The facilities which are used by many clubs in the area are in disrepair and require an upgrade.”

Residents on this road have raised the issue that the level of street lighting has deteriorated since the erection of the construction site hoarding and request the levels be improved by whatever means, as there has been an increase in illegal dumping and anti-social behaviour in the locality as a result.”

“To ask the manager to arrange for the continuation of the recent excellent work by the local council team carrying out housekeeping/ weed removal of the public pavement areas/ Traffic Islands/ at Bus Stops on the” lower” Oscar Traynor Road right up to the “upper “ section of the road at Coolock Lane.”

“To ask the manager for an update on progress with the re-opening of the Kilmore Youth Centre which was recently closed and is a vital amenity for local youth and other groups.”

Can we arrange to implement measures to slow turning traffic, signage indicating children at play and a mirror or similar to improve visibility on this corner.”
